THE BAPTISM SERVICE

1) The Service

The form of the service is a carefully crafted response of the whole faith community to God's love and grace in Jesus together with its understanding of what it is to be the people of God.

The Greeting:

The greeting is significantly a welcome into the Family of God. It crosses all the divides that we regard as important. It reminds us that our identity is rooted in Christ.

The Introduction:

This simply underlines what we have stressed so often. It is all about God's undeserved love and what that has won for us by the loving obedience of Jesus on the cross.

Support for the child:

Without support, teaching and training, no child will be able to live out the promised baptismal vows in a way that will lead to Confirmation.

It is helpful here to expand on the effects of evil in obvious and the not so obvious ways in our communities. Ultimately, all of these reflect the marks of the "thief" that Jesus speaks of in John 10: 10.

4) The Allegiance

It is a good idea to explore the things that the parents want this to mean in their child's life.
